You have heard talk about the changes and new branding for UMW. I have included information from the National Organization about the changes we can expect. There will be more information coming and if you are attending Assembly in person or on zoom you will hear more about this.

Frequently Asked Questions On Upcoming Changes for United Methodist Women

Exactly what changes will we be seeing and when?

Big changes are on the horizon for United Methodist Women in 2022. The changes will include:

- A new look with updated and exciting ways of sharing our mission story
- A new easier-to-navigate website that will have:
- o A homepage designed to pique new women's interest in our organization and start them on a journey to membership, and
- o A special portal on the homepage where members can log in to access resources specially designed for them.
- Soul Care Retreats with templates. This is a pilot member-recruitment program through which current members invite nonmember friends to themed retreats specially designed to nurture our bodies, minds and souls. The retreats end with an invitation to join and/or learn more about turning your love into action through United Methodist Women.
- Mission u innovations. In response to today's increased demands on women's time and conference United Methodist Women's stretched capacities, the Mission u program is being updated. Beginning in 2022, Mission u will introduce three new curricula each year—one for children, one for youth and one for adults—all focusing on a shared biblical theme. The new Mission u curricula will be more accessible and adaptable for use in small groups, local churches, vacation Bible schools, retreats and other settings. Through these vibrant, relevant, justice-oriented and biblically centered curricula, Mission u will continue its commitment to learning together for the transformation of the world and expand its impact.
- A new national membership option. This will enable women to join our sisterhood via our new website. They will learn about and be able to participate in programs and events online or connect in person to local units if they so choose.
- More targeted giving options. Members and nonmembers alike want more options to target their financial gifts to specific program areas, such as Spiritual Growth or our priority justice issues.
- New tools for treasurers. New tools, like Vanco Faith, will be available to enable treasurers to collect and manage giving and registrations electronically.
- Innovations in the Leadership Development Days programs.
- New and innovative resources, including:
- o Mighty Networks, an exciting new online platform where members can connect, and engage new resources like the Program Resource and Mission u curricula.
- o The Daily Prayer Guide, an updated replacement of The Prayer Calendar, which offers opportunities for daily devotion and connection.

How is this going to affect me and my unit?

The structure and operations of United Methodist Women on the local, district and conference levels will continue as they are, but new and improved tools and programs will be available to help each level nurture current members and reach out to new women.

<u>I've heard about changes coming to United Methodist Women and something about New Wineskins.</u> What's all this about?

New Wineskins refers to Jesus' metaphor in Mark 2:21-22 where he prepares people for big changes that are coming by explaining that new times require ways of doing things.

"No one sews a patch of unshrunk cloth on an old garment. Otherwise, the new piece will pull away from the old, making the tear worse. And no one pours new wine into old wineskins. Otherwise, the wine will burst the skins, and both the wine and the wineskins will be ruined. No, they pour new wine into new wineskins." Mark 2:21-22 (NIV)

United Methodist Women is again saying "yes" to being part of what God is doing in the 21st century by creating new and improved ways for women today to gather for faith, sisterhood and action to improve life for women, children and youth.

For United Methodist Women at this time, New Wineskins refers to:

- 1. The exciting changes on the horizon for United Methodist Women, and
- 2. Sharing this great news with members.
- 3. Preparing members for these changes and launch of this rebranding of our organization

I'm hearing United Methodist Women is rebranding. What does it mean?

"Brand" is just a term to describe what people can expect you to consistently deliver. "Branding" includes the things we do—our look, our actions, and our messages— that let people know who we are and what we consistently deliver.

Rebranding United Methodist Women means we are changing the way we tell our story and our look as well as updating our programs, resources and outreach efforts so that we are more nurturing to current members and are more welcoming to new women and those of diverse backgrounds and life stages.

I heard there's a New Wineskins online course. May I take it?

The New Wineskins online courses are available now to Program Advisory Group members, conference officers and district presidents. However, in January, a PPT version will be available for use in conference, districts, and local units.

These are exciting times for UMW. Let's embrace the changes to make UMW more relevant in the 21st century.

Spiritual Growth

How Do You Shine?

As I am writing this message we are coming upon Transfiguration Sunday. We have heard many times of the story of the Transfiguration. So truly how do you shine? Is it your kindness? Are you bold, and the voice of those who have none? Are you a quiet person who is contemplative, and then speaks with confidence? We are United Methodist Women! (When I was preparing this and made an error and wrote – We are United Methodist Women? – I think that is a message there!) Let us look at the message from 2 Corinthians, 3:12-4:2. Let us read this with the joyful strength that is ours as we continue to join our voices in small, and large gatherings, in our home churches, and when alone, knowing that we truly will never walk alone.

2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2

- 3:12 Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness,
- 3:13 not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside.
- 3:14 But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only in Christ is it set aside.
- 3:15 Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds;
- 3:16 but when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed.
- 3:17 Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.
- 3:18 And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit.
- 4:1 Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart.
- 4:2 We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God.



We are leaving the Epiphany season to begin our Lenten journey. Each day offers many ways to hear, feel, and get caught in the feeling of "hopelessness". These same days offer many ways to share love, hope, kindness, joy and compassion. We all can share many experiences about "how terrible things are now". Are they truly terrible? Yes, some truly are. Could we use other adjectives like difficult, challenging, or frustrating? There are other words that are used as well. (Yes, some that should not be written.) We know this is the time to walk even more closely with our Savior. It is a time that we can put aside all that is not beneficial to wellness, for ourselves and other persons. I have a request. Although we need technology to communicate these days, please allow a good deal of time for you. Yes, to be quiet, silly, any emotions that you need to get out. Even at times a good scream feels great. You know what it is. Then "Let your light so shine before all persons, that they may see you and your good works, and glorify our Triune God in heaven.

Let us always be in prayer also for all humankind throughout the world. May there be peace.
